Telowie Gorge Conservation Park** is home to the rare and beautiful Yellow-footed rock wallaby. These striking animals are found in rocky habitats, common in this park. It's then onto Port Augusta where we explore the Flinders Ranges in the **Wadlata Outback Centre's Tunnel of Time**. Discover its origins, the **Aboriginal Dreaming**, explorers and much more. After a light lunch we head to the Southern Flinders Ranges via **Wilmington and Orroroo** where we visit a 900-year Old River Red Gum These **ancient ranges rise up 750 metres (2,400feet) above sea level** to give **spectacular views** in every direction. If you enjoy **pristine untouched Australia**, away from the tourist crowd, this is the tour for you. After enjoying the serenity of the **Southern Flinders Ranges** we head back to Adelaide via the wine making region of the **Clare Valley** arriving approximately 6:00PM. We suggest you bring your camera and plenty of film.

It's then on to Wilpena Resort for our first night in the Flinders Ranges. Before dinner we stretch our legs on a peaceful bushwalk to **Wangarra Lookouts** which overlook Wilpena Pound.

**DAY 2:** Today we head to **Arkaroola via Brachina Gorge- (This Gorge traces the geological history of the Flinders Ranges for hundreds of million years)**, to **Parachilna's Prairie Hotel** for some Aussie tucker (optional). After morning tea we head to **IGA WARTA, where we spend some time learning about the ADNYMATHANHA culture and environment**. Today we can also participate in **a bush tucker walk and/or an Aboriginal art walk**. This evening, after dinner, we spend some time sitting around a campfire sampling traditional damper with quandong jam, **listening to stories and music of the Adnyamathanha People Overnight Iga Warta**.

**DAY 3:** After breakfast we head to **Arkaroola** visiting **Paralana Hot Springs** where water emerges at a temperature of 80 degrees Celsius from rocks containing Jasper and ochre. Nearby is **Yudnamutana Gorge- one of Australia's deepest gorges**. We also visit Stubbs Waterhole- an expanse of still water in a delightful setting reflecting the green foliage of gum trees and the blue the sky, set deep between towering steeply tilted layers of rock formed from the debris dropped by melting icebergs around 700 million years ago. Overnight **Arkaroola Wilderness Sanctuary**

**DAY 4:** Depart Arkaroola for Adelaide via Chambers Gorge and Blinman. Our next stop is **Sacred Canyon** where we stretch our legs on a short walk into the gorge. **Sacred Canyon is one of the major Aboriginal art sites in the Flinders Ranges**. After lunch at **Wilpena Resort** we head to Quorn, driving through Buckaringa Gorge and Warren Gorge (time permitting). Afternoon tea is at Melrose and then it's on to Adelaide. ## **CULTURAL NOTES:**

### **RESPECTING RESTRICTIONS:**

There may be places that are closed to visitors because of their cultural significance-heed advice if you are asked not to enter an area.

In some places it is culturally inappropriate to swim or fish in waterways, waterholes and/or sea country.

Some places can only be visited by men or women- please respect these protocols where they apply to non indigenous people.

When are in doubt about where you and cannot go it is good practice to ask first.

The possession and consumption of alcohol is restricted in some indigenous communities-these restrictions apply to non indigenous visitors.

### **RESPECTING PEOPLES PRIVACY:**

If you are visiting an Aboriginal community, wait until you are invited to approach homes or groups of people.

Funerals and cultural ceremonies are times of special privacy- use extra sensitivity in communities at these times. Please note we may be limited or prevented from entering some areas or communities due to these events.

### **TALKING TO INDIGENOUS PEOPLE:**

If you are talking to an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander recognise that they may communicate differently to non-indigenous people- English may be a second or third language.

Access to specific cultural knowledge or stories may not be open to everyone - it is best to avoid direct questions about matters that could be sensitive unless invited to do so.

Dress etiquette applies when visiting some indigenous communities - if in doubt avoid wearing short skirts, short shorts or other revealing clothing.

### **TAKING PHOTOGRAPHS AND FILMING:**

Always ask before filming or taking photographs of a person, a group of people or cultural activities.

Photographing and filming some places and subjects is restricted for cultural reasons - please respect the important request from traditional owners.

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If you intend to use your photographs in a publication or for other commercial purposes, you will need to seek copyright permission from the people featured in the photo.

## **TAKING HOME A MOMENTO:**

Locally produced Aboriginal art and craftwork make an excellent memory of your visit to a place - if possible choose items designed and made by Aboriginal people. Look and ask for items that have a label of cultural authenticity.

Purchasing items from Aboriginal people through respected outlets helps to create economic support for people in communities where there may be limited employment opportunities.

Please do not remove rocks or other objects from Aboriginal land or waters without permission of traditional owners. Disturbing cultural sites is also prohibited by Australian law.

Tour duration is 3 hours.

### **Uluru Walk**

#### Morning Sunrise Tour

Follow the oldest walking track on earth around the base of Uluru on a 9km easy amble. Hear some of the Aboriginal stories associated with the Rock and view ancient Aboriginal art. Marvel at the diverse plant and animal life and learn how Aboriginal people used these scarce resources to survive. Examine tracks of nocturnal animals. Experience the beauty and mystery of Uluru at dawn. Departs approximately 6am, returns at approximately 11am.

### **Spirit Of Uluru**

#### Morning Sunrise Tour

This is a vehicle-based version of the Uluru Walk. Witness the spectacular sunrise without rushing. Learn of the natural history and the significance to the Anangu people as you take short walks around Uluru. Visit waterholes and view the rock art at a relaxed pace. ## **Uluru Sunrise & Kata Tjuta Valley of The Winds Walk**

Rise early this morning and travel to the Uluru sunrise viewing area to see the Red Centre set alight by the first rays of sun. Enjoy a warming cup of tea or coffee as the colours of Uluru gradually change as the sun rises on the horizon. Commence a base tour of Uluru, including a guided walk into Mutitjulu waterhole. View Aboriginal rock paintings and learn about the flora, fauna and Aboriginal history from your Driver/Guide. Continue around the base of Uluru by coach and see various sacred areas. Visit the Uluru – Kata Tjuta Cultural Centre where there is time to read the Tjukurpa (Aboriginal law) or purchase some locally made Aboriginal art. Departs 90 minutes prior to sunrise and returns at approximately 12.00pm.

## **Kuniya Sunset Tour**

### Afternoon Sunset Tour

The Kuniya Sunset Tour gives you a very special introduction to the spirit and culture of Uluru. After being picked up at your hotel, spend time in the Uluru-Kata Tjuta Cultural Centre before joining your Aboriginal guide for the spectacular and fascinating Kuniya Walk. Discover local bush foods, and hear tales of desert survival. Watching the colours of Uluru changing at sunset is the perfect end to this fascinating experience. Tour departs at approximately 2.30pm, returning at approximately 7pm.

## **Mt Conner Outback Safari**

### Afternoon-Evening Tour

Located 100kms east of Uluru on the fringe of Curtin Springs cattle station, Mt Conner is the third of the great monoliths. The tour visits vast salt lakes that are remnants of ancient inland oceans and examines fossilized remains. As you circle Mt Connor by 4WD you'll be surprised to find a hidden series of rugged gorges, a perfect haven for Red Kangaroos and Rock Wallabies. Enjoy a glass of champagne as the sun goes down over the changing colour of Mt Conner. Then drive to Curtin Springs to enjoy a three-course dinner prepared by the station cook, before returning to Ayers Rock Resort. Tour departs approximately 2.30pm and returns 9.30pm.

## **1-day Kings Canyon (ex Ayers Rock)**

### Full Day Tour

Drive through the sand hill country to Kings Canyon, stopping for breakfast at Kings Creek Station (own expense) along the

### **About The Bama Way....**

The Bama Way is an Aboriginal journey through Tropical North Queensland; a journey along story-lines through coastal mangroves, rich rainforest and hilltop Savannah. The word 'Bama' (pronounced Bumma) is widely used throughout Cape York to mean an Aboriginal person, but in both Kuku Yalanji and Guugu Yimithirr, the word simply means 'person' regardless of nationality or race.

The Bama Way was developed by three highly -acclaimed Aboriginal-owned tours—Guurrbi Tours, Walker Family Tours, and Kuku Yalanji Cultural Habitat Tours—Each Aboriginal tour has a different story to tell. You can learn how to spearfish with the Kubirri Warra brothers on one of their beach, mud flat and mangrove walks...meet the Walker sisters from the Nyungkul clan, traditional custodians of the Bloomfield Falls....and spend a magical time with Nugal-warra Elder, Willie Gordon, amongst the Nugal rock art sites, high in the hills above Hope Vale. Accompanied by an Aboriginal driver-guide, this special journey allows you to see this beautiful and diverse corner of Far North Queensland through the eyes of its traditional custodians, whose links to the country span tens of thousands of years. It will give you an unforgettable insight into the area's rich Aboriginal history and culture, and will have you thinking about your own place in the world, and your relationship with the land.

**DAY 15:** Today, your journey of discovery begins as you travel north along one of Australia's most scenic coastal drives to Cooya Beach to join Kubirri Warra brothers of Kuku Yalanji Cultural Habitat Tours, on one of their beach, mudflat and mangrove walks. This is time to get native Linc and Brandon Walker follow the traditions of their ancestors who, for thousands of years, educated visitors about their traditional country in order to ensure the survival of their Kuku Yalanji culture.

Today the brothers teach their guests how to throw a spear, hunt whilst stalking and observing wildlife and country, and how to track coastal resources.

They share some of their extensive knowledge of this special area and how they care for their country. Enjoy fresh, homemade damper, tea and coffee, before continuing along the Daintree Coast where we cross the mighty Daintree River by cable ferry. This great serpent of water is a special Aboriginal meeting and trading place. Our journey takes us through Cape Tribulation where we lunch at Coconut Beach Resort. We continue through the World Heritage Listed Daintree National Park, journey through this spectacular example of Mother Nature, which contains the highest number of plant and animal species that are rare, or threatened by extinction. Overnight, Cape Tribulation and experience one of the world's most diverse and beautiful examples of Mother Nature.

**DAY 16:** After breakfast, this morning we continue in to the heart of the World Heritage Listed Daintree National Park, and travel the famous 4wd only Bloomfield Track, crossing mountain ranges and rivers. At Wujal Wujal we visit the Bloomfield Falls in the company of traditional custodians from the Walker Family, This is a very special place for the Kuku Yalanji Bama, so it is disrespectful to go there, unless accompanied by one of the traditional custodians. The Walker Family will share some of their knowledge about this special and sacred place. We journey on to Helenvale, where we lunch at the famous Aussie bush pub, The Lions Den Hotel. Visit the mysterious Black Mountains steeped in Aboriginal legend before arriving in Cooktown for your overnight stay. Enjoy free time to explore historical Cooktown, rich in history, rich in nature and rich in spirit. Nestling on North Queensland's stunning tropical wilderness coast, this small historic town, with its pristine environment steeped in Aboriginal culture, has everything to offer those looking for a taste of real Australia. Named after Captain James Cook who careened the H M Endeavour in 1770, the town has a rich modern history, and an Aboriginal history which stretches back tens of thousands of years. Once Australia's second busiest port during the Palmer River goldrush, today the town has a population of only 2,000, but the buildings, statues and world-class James Cook Museum, reflect its rich past.

**DAY 17:** Enjoy a tropical breakfast before this mornings tour and magical experience with Nugal-warra Elder, Willie Gordon, the traditional story-teller of the Nugal-warraclan, takes you to the his ancestral rock art sites, set in stunning country side

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high in the hills above Hope Vale, 40 minutes from Cooktown. You'll visit six sites, including the Reconciliation Cave and an ancestral Birthing Site, where Willie shares the stories behind the art—stories which can only be told by Elders of the Nugalclan—and explains how the paintings speak of the essence of life and the lores of his people. With his great smile and infectious laugh, Willie gives you an amazing insight into Aboriginal society and spirituality, and has you thinking about your own relationship with the land and how the lores of his people can apply to us all. The tour includes an estimated 30-minute bush walk on generally easy terrain. Water is provided, and cameras are welcome. Return to Cooktown for a delicious lunch at the Nature Power house museum. The return journey we travel along the Great Dividing Range, the backbone of Australia which takes you through the spectacular scenery of Far North Queensland's outback, and the diverse landscape of the Palmer River goldfield region. Your tour of amazing discovery comes to a close as you are transferred back to your accommodation early evening.

**DAY 18:** Today we board a flight to Darwin for the final part of our journey

**DAY 19 & 20:**

## **1 Day Tiwi Island Itinerary:**

A day tour to Bathurst Island provides a unique opportunity to experience a modern day Aboriginal community and learn about the history and the culture of the Tiwi People from a local resident's perspective.

After a 20 minute scenic flight you arrive at Bathurst Island. Here you are met by your local Guide to be taken on a journey through the progressive, modern day Aboriginal community of Nguiu. Visit the museum with its interesting displays of traditional art and depictions of the Tiwi 'dreamtime' stories and Early Mission Precinct with its unique Tiwi style Catholic Church. Be taken through the successful arts and crafts centres and see where the artists work. You also have the opportunity to purchase Tiwi arts and crafts and screen printed fabric at Island prices. At morning tea we spend time with some Tiwi Ladies enjoying billy tea and damper while they work on their weaving and painting. Your guides and the ladies also demonstrate their totem dances and perform a smoking ceremony to bless the visitors and explain the meanings behind them. Learn some of the complex rituals associated with the Pukamani (burial ceremony). Set out for a scenic drive through the wilderness of Bathurst Island. Enjoy lunch and visit a local waterhole for a swim (bring swimmers and towel). Learn about traditional bush tuckers, bush medicine and natural fibres and dyes on your return to the community for your return flight to Darwin.

## **OR 2 DAY TOUR OPTION**

### **2 Day Tiwi Island Itinerary:**

A two day camping tour to Bathurst Island provides a unique opportunity to experience a modern day Aboriginal community and learn about the history and the culture of the Tiwi People from a local resident's perspective, plus the adventure of camping in a remote location and learning more about the way of life on the Island.

#### **Day 1: Tiwi Islands**

After a scenic flight you arrive at Bathurst Island. Here you are met by your guide to be taken on a journey through the progressive community of Nguiu. Visit the museum and learn about the Tiwi history and culture. Explore some successful arts and crafts centres and see artists' work. You also have the opportunity to purchase some Tiwi arts and crafts, screen-printed fabric and clothing at Island prices. Spend time with some Tiwi Ladies enjoying billy tea and damper while they work on their weaving and painting, and show you their totem dances. Set out for a scenic drive through the wilderness of Bathurst Island. Enjoy lunch and visit a local waterhole for a swim (bring swimmers and towel). Learn about traditional bush tucker, bush medicine and natural fibres and dyes. Later, head off to Moantu (the home of the Rainbow Serpent) and set up camp at this picturesque spot overlooking a large freshwater lake. Take a walk over the sand dunes to admire the view and a Tiwi Island sunset before dinner around the campfire.

Accommodation: Moantu Camp, Bathurst Island.

(Lunch, Dinner)

#### **Day 2: Cape Fourcroy**

After breakfast travel out to the westernmost point of Bathurst Island – Cape Fourcroy and explore the rugged coastline. Walk

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along this beautiful beach in search of turtle nests. There will be many opportunities to see a diverse range of native wildlife, so don't forget your cameras! Learn about traditional uses of the native flora and fauna with your Tiwi guide. Visit Tomorrupi Waterfall and cool off in the refreshing water and enjoy a picnic lunch. Visit a Tiwi Burial Site and learn about some of the complex rituals associated with the Pukumani Poles (Burial Poles) before returning to Nguiu for your return flight to Darwin. (Breakfast, Lunch)

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## JUST CRUISIN 3 DAY GAWLER RANGES

**DAY 1:** Depart Adelaide 8:00AM for Port Augusta- the crossroads of Australia, where we explore the Flinders Ranges and Outback in **Wadlata Outback Centres Tunnel of Time**. We discover its origins, Aboriginal Dreaming and much more. After lunch we head to a working sheep station. **Pandurra Station is a fully functional sheep and cattle property** running between 25,000 and 30,000 sheep with 300 cattle. Overnight **historical Pandurra Station**.

**DAY 2:** After breakfast you can enjoy a trail ride which can incorporate the **true outback experience of mustering and droving stock**. **OR** We can enjoy a tour of the station; looking at all the aspects of station life, Flora, fauna and especially bird life are made interesting with a **Pandurra Station** guide. Today we also travel out to the **Gawler Ranges**. As we travel along the winding gravel road it is difficult to comprehend that these gentle and peaceful hills were the result of powerful volcanic activity millions of years ago. The ranges are renowned for wildflowers in spring, and the first recorded observation of South Australia's floral emblem, Sturt's Desert Pea. There are some 150 species of birds recorded and the more are the emu, wedge-tailed eagle, crested pigeons, galah, willy wagtail and the singing honey eater. Also common in the Ranges are the Red Kangaroo, Western Grey Kangaroo and Euro.

**DAY 3:** Depart approximately 9:00AM for Adelaide via Port Augusta and the **Southern Flinders Ranges**. We travel through the Southern Flinders Ranges to Wilmington and Orroroo where we enjoy lunch at a 900 year old River Red Gum. Our next stop is the **Pekina Ranges for a Top of the Range 4WD Tour**. These ancient Ranges rise 750 metres (2,400 feet) above sea level to give a spectacular view in every direction. 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## JUST CRUISIN 3 DAY MOUNT GAMBIER SOUTH AUSTRALIA

**DAY 1:** Depart Adelaide approximately 9:00AM for **Mount Gambier** via the South Eastern Freeway where we join the Princes Highway at Murray Bridge. **We travel along the Coorong (A Wetland of International Importance, the Coorong and the adjoining Lower Murray Lakes stretch from the mouth of the Murray to north of Kingston. Less than 3 kilometres wide, it is an inland sea of shallow lagoons).** At Kingston South East we visit the **Analemmetic Sun Dial (one of only eight in the world)**. After lunch we head to Mount Gambier visiting the South East towns of Robe, Beachport, Millicent and Tantanoola. At Tantanoola we visit **Tantanoola Caves** (own expense). (Hotel/Motel accommodation).

**DAY 2:** Depart accommodation approximately 9:00AM to enjoy the sights of Mount Gambier, including The **Blue Lake Aquifer tour, Valley Lake - where we climb Mount Gambier to the Centenary Tower** for a remarkable view of the city, lakes and surrounding country side. We also visit **Umpherston Sinkhole, Cave Gardens** and **Mount Schank, an extinct volcano**. With its dry volcanic crater, it is an easy walk to the crater edge, and the view from the top one of sheer wonder.

**DAY 3:** Depart approximately 9:00AM for Adelaide, via **The Coonawarra Wine Region** where we can sample local wines. These wrecks can be recounted in detail in **Warrnambool's Flagstaff Hill Maritime Museum**. Overnight Warrnambool.

**DAY 3:** After breakfast, an option this morning is a **helicopter flight** (own expense) from the Warrnambool breakwater. Leaving Warrnambool, we head toward Apollo Bay on the **Great Ocean Road** travelling through Port **Campbell, Lavers Hill, Otway National Park and Apollo Bay. It is along this section of the Great Ocean Road the flat coastal plains terminate in a series of vertical cliffs, caverns, archways, blowholes and offshore rock stacks.** It is here we see the spectacular rock formations of **The Twelve Apostles, Loch Ard Gorge, The Grotto, London Bridge, Sentinel Rock and The Blow Hole**. The Blow Hole is a large hole about 350 metres inland from the cliffs. Waves rush into it through a tunnel from the sea, the entrance to which can be seen from the cliffs. At Lavers Hill we visit **Tower Hill. It is believed to have been formed 30,000 years ago by a volcanic eruption.** Violent explosions created a shallow crater 11 kilometres in circumference, which now holds a lake. A climb to the **Tower Hill** peak offers spectacular views of the ocean, Warrnambool and surrounding farmland. From Lavers Hill we visit **Cape Otway Lighthouse** in the **Otway National Park**. The lighthouse has been a valuable navigational aid since its light first operated in August 1848. The light, at a height of 91 metres, has a range of 38 kilometres in clear weather. We now make our way to **Apollo Bay** for over night stop.

**DAY 4:** Depart **Apollo Bay** approximately 9:00AM and head to Lorne where we visit **Erskine Falls, Henderson Falls and Won Wondah Falls**. Mount Gambier is our destination for the return trip back to Adelaide. We follow **The Great Ocean Road** back to Mount Gambier.

We walk on the beach within a few metres of the resting sea lions, basking in the sun. We now head to Little Sahara, an area of spectacular white sand dunes surrounded by bush vegetation. Climbing over the first ridge you are confronted by a second and much higher dune, which when scaled reveals more dunes flanked by bushland. Vivonne Bay is also visited and can only be described as stunningly beautiful. We now follow the coast to Antechamber Bay and Chapman River. At Antechamber Bay there are wonderful views of Antechamber's long wide stretch of beach, with the mainland in the background. Chapman River runs from Lashmar Lagoon into Antechamber Bay, it is here we have morning tea and a stroll down the beach will reveal the startling splendour of Antechamber Bay. Cape Willoughby Lighthouse is our next stop. This was the first lighthouse built in South Australia, completed in 1852. Adjacent to the lighthouse is the rugged Devil's Kitchen. We now head to Kingscote via Windmill Bay. The beach here is covered with almost perfectly round rocks and pebbles; a look at the roaring surf as it crashes over the rocks soon gives you a clue to their formation. The beach also has a freshwater well, which provides water for stock. Along the way to Prospect Hill The hill is the highest point in the area and provides a marvellous view of Pelican Lagoon, the rolling hills and the Southern Ocean at Pennington Bay which is a wonderful surf beach. On a clear day looking north you can see Mount Lofty in the Adelaide Hills. Overnight Kingscote. Tonight we can watch the Pelicans feeding at the wharf.

**DAY 9 & 10:** We spend the next 2 days in *Uluru and Kata Tjuta National Park*. This gives us plenty of time to appreciate the *Aboriginal culture and environment on a 2-hour tour with an Aboriginal guide*. We can also enjoy a walk around the base of *Uluru/Ayers Rock*. A number of *optional tours* are available from Yulara. These include: *Harley Davidson Tour of Uluru/Ayers Rock, Camel rides to Uluru/Ayers Rock, Helicopter flights over the Rock and Olgas*, many more are available. (Optional tours at own expense)

**DAY 11:** Today we head to *Coober Pedy in the heart of South Australia's vast outback*; it is an *opal wonderland*. The town takes its name from the Aboriginal word Kupa (uninitiated man or white man) and Piti (hole). We also visit the *Breakaway's Reserve and Moon Plain*. We spend tonight in an *underground motel*

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**DAY 12:** After breakfast we spend some time visiting mines and interpretive centres which offer a great insight into the town and its mining operations. There are more than 30 opal shops in **Coober Pedy** if you like to purchase some opal. After lunch we head to **William Creek via the Oodnadatta Track**. William Creek is **the world's most isolated pub** where you can indulge in a well-deserved **Australian beer**. The most important claim to fame for William Creek is that it is the smallest town in Australia and that it is located on **the worlds largest cattle station (Anna Creek Station) which is 32500 square kilometres**. A walk along the old Ghan Railway line to the bridge at Breakfast Time Creek can also be enjoyed. Overnight **William Creek Hotel**.

**DAY 13:** Our destination today is **Marree** via the **Oodnadatta Track**. This a land of contrasts, there's red gibber plains stretching to the horizon, mound springs (we visit **Bubbler Springs and Blanche Cup Springs**) which create bush oases and wetlands, red gum lined creeks and vast areas of grey salt bush spiky Spinifex. At **Coward Springs** you have a chance of a **relaxing soak in a hot pool**. Remnants of the **old Ghan Railway** are abundant along **the Oodnadatta Track**. Our first stop is **Lyndhurst** where we visit the **spectacular red and brown ochre cliffs**. From the ochre cliffs we head to the ghost town of Farina, which was set up in 1882 as a farming centre and railhead for wool and cattle. From Farina ruins we head to **Marree** where we stop for lunch. After lunch we continue along the **Oodnadatta Track**. This a land of contrasts, there's red gibber plains stretching to the horizon, mound springs (we visit **Bubbler Springs and Blanche Cup Springs**) which create bush oases and wetlands, red gum lined creeks and vast areas of grey salt bush spiky Spinifex. At **Coward Springs** you have a chance of a **relaxing soak in a hot pool**. Remnants of the **old Ghan Railway** are abundant along **the Oodnadatta Track**.

**DAY 14 (Optional):** Today's destination is **Iga Warta**, where we spend some time learning about the **Adnymathanha culture and environment. listening to stories and music of the Adnymathanha people**. Our first stop is the ghost town of **Farina**, which was **set up in 1882** as a farming centre and railhead for wool and cattle. From Farina we head to **Lyndhurst** where we visit the **spectacular red and brown ochre cliffs**. From the ochre cliffs we head to **Iga Warta** to participate in a bush tucker walk and/or Aboriginal art walk (own expense). This evening after dinner we sit around a campfire sampling traditional damper with quandong jam, Overnight **Iga Warta** (bungalow or camping).

**DAY 15:** After breakfast we head to Wilpena Resort via Blinman, where we can see remnants of the original township built in 1859. We also visit the Blinman Hotel (built in 1865 and still trading) for a well-deserved ice cold Aussie beer. At Wilpena we have a peaceful bushwalk to **Wangarra Lookouts** and the Hill Homestead. After our walk we visit **Sacred Canyon and Arkaroo Rock which are major Aboriginal Art sites (time permitting)**. Overnight **Wilpena Resort**.

**DAY 16:** Depart **Wilpena Pound Resort** 9:00AM for Adelaide via the geological trail through the **Bunyerroo Gorge and Brachina Gorge**, (This gorge traces the geological history of the area for hundreds of million years), Hawker, Port Pirie, Port Germein and Port Augusta (the crossroads of Australia). From Hawker we visit Kanyaka ruins and Death Rock. If you are feeling energetic perhaps we can climb up to see the **Yourambulla Caves, where we view Aboriginal rock painting**. At Port Augusta we explore the Flinders Ranges and Outback in **Wadlata Outback Centre's Tunnel of Time**. We discover its origins, the Aboriginal Dreaming, European settlement and much more. After lunch we head towards Adelaide, arriving approximately 6:00PM at your accommodation.

It's now onto **Port Victoria (Known as the last of the windjammer ports, the last square rigger to use the port was The Pamir in 1949) and Port Vincent (Long known as a holiday playground, it is set in a beautiful sweeping bay)** where we stretch our legs on a foreshore walking trail. We now follow the highway on the east coast to **Ardrossan** and **Port Clinton**. From here we head to Adelaide via Port Wakefield arriving at your accommodation at approximately 5:00PM.
